

Department of Education Reporting Requirements for CARES Act: Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund

The total amount of funds Bradley University will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Student is \$2,138,007.

The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed by Bradley University to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of January 31, 2021 was \$2,128,392.33.

The estimated total number of students at Bradley University eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act is approximately 4,000 students based upon the number of FAFSA's received by Bradley University for the 2019-2020 academic year or previous years.

The total number of Bradley University students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant from Bradley University under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CARES Act as of January 31, 2021 was 4,054.
